

THE ORDER OF SERVICE

Pastor: We begin this Christian Victory Service in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Assembly: (spoken) Amen.

P: We have come together to seek God's comfort in our sorrow and to rejoice in the promise of the resurrection. Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who said: "Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." Let us pray.

Lord Jesus, You wept at the grave of Your friend Lazarus, and You consoled Mary and Martha in their distress. Draw near to us who mourn for Stacy, and dry the tears of all who weep. Calm our troubled hearts, dispel our doubts and fears, and lead us to praise You for having brought her to faith. In Your rising from the dead, You conquered death and opened the gates to eternal life. Strengthen us with Your Word, and lead us through this earthly life until at last we are united with You and all the saints in glory everlasting.

P: The LORD watches over you—the LORD is your shade at your right hand; A: the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night.

P: The LORD will keep you from all harm—he will watch over your life; A: the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.

P: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, A: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

I need thy presence ev'ry passing hour. What but thy grace can foil the tempter's pow'r? Who like thyself my guide and stay can be? Through cloud and sunshine, oh, abide with me!

- P: We hear these words of Resurrection Comfort: Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God. The Apostle Paul writes to the Romans: "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Jesus gives us this comfort: "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die." Death has been swallowed up in victory! Thanks be to God!
- A: He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

P: When Christ, who is our life appears,

A: Then we also will appear with him in glory,

P: We will be before the throne of God

A: And serve him day and night in his temple.

P: Never again will we hunger;

A: Never again will we thirst.

P: For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be our shepherd; he will lead us to springs of living water.

A: And God will wipe away every tear from our eyes.

P: Let us pray. God of all grace, You sent Your Son Jesus to destroy the power of death and to open the kingdom of heaven to all believers. Make us certain that because He lives, we too shall live. Comfort us with Your promise that neither death nor life nor things present nor things to come shall be able to separate us from Your love which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

A Reading from Holy Scripture --- Deuteronomy 6:4-12

Stacy made it clear by how she lived, including by the decorations in the home, she was walking with the Lord.

Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ⁵Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. ⁶These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. ⁷Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. ⁸Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. ⁹Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates. ¹⁰When the LORD your God brings you into the land he swore to your

fathers, to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to give you—a land with large, flourishing cities you did not build, ¹¹ houses filled with all kinds of good things you did not provide, wells you did not dig, and vineyards and olive groves you did not plant—then when you eat and are satisfied, ¹² be careful that you do not forget the LORD, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.

P: The Word of the Lord. A: Thanks be to God.

A Reading from Holy Scripture --- Ephesians 6:10-18

By the grace of God, daily Stacy put on the armor of God; leaving an example for us.

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹ Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. ¹² For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. ¹³ Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. ¹⁸ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

A Reading from Holy Scripture --- John 15:1-8

The theme continues, that of Stacy remaining connected to Jesus through the ups and downs of this life, bearing beautiful fruits of faith.

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

P: Remove our fears, and make us bold to pray with confidence as our Savior has taught us:

A: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

A look at Stacy's earthly journey

Stacy Ann Moller was born on January 23, 1952, to her loving parents, George and Eileen Longhway. Her older sister and lifelong best friend, Linda, was born three years prior. As a child, Stacy learned to play the piano, often filling the home with the sound of religious hymns or a favorite melody.

Due to her father's work, the family moved frequently. Stacy attended 26 different schools before graduating from Radnor High School in Radnor, Pennsylvania, in 1970. She went on to attend Bethany Lutheran College in Mankato, Minnesota, where she earned an Associate of Arts degree. Shortly after, she moved to California, where her life took a beautiful turn.

In 1975, while working as a hostess at Black Angus, Stacy met the love of her life, Dan Moller. Their connection was immediate, and after only two weeks, they were engaged. On November 5, 1975, just a month after meeting, Dan and Stacy were married at Trinity Lutheran Church in Gardnerville, Nevada. They were blessed with three daughters-Andrea, Kimberly, Jacklyn, and a bonus daughter Stacy. Dan and Stacy shared just shy of 49 years of marriage, a union rooted in faith, love, and friendship. Their bond was a shining example to their family and all who knew them.

As 1 Corinthians 13:13 says, "And now these three remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love." Stacy's life embodied this verse, as love was at the heart of everything she did. Her faith in Jesus Christ was unwavering, and she lived every day as a testament to that love. She found peace, strength, and purpose in her relationship with God, which was the center of her life. Stacy made it her mission to pass on that faith to her children and grandchildren, and she was full of grace and love for everyone she met. She served others joyfully, whether by teaching Sunday School, Vacation Bible School or volunteering in her community. She believed in sharing the love of Christ with everyone she encountered, always seeking to serve and reflect the light of her Savior.

Stacy understood the importance of family and treasured it, knowing that not everyone was blessed with a place to call home. Over the years, she extended her heart and home to countless people, welcoming them with open arms and the same warmth she offered her own family. Stacy believed that family was much more about love than blood, and through her faith, she welcomed many into our family as if they were her own. She saw every person as a child of God, deserving of love, care, and grace. Stacy treated each person with the same compassion and kindness she showed her closest relatives, because she believed that, in Christ, we are all part of one family.

Forgiveness was central to Stacy's beliefs, and she taught that no one was beyond redemption. She believed in offering second chances freely and that true love includes both forgiveness and the courage to ask for it. Stacy's family learned from her the importance of saying, "I'm sorry," and truly meaning it, and they learned to offer forgiveness to others as well as themselves. Grace, to Stacy, was a gift from God to be extended to all.


