## Growing in Grace Opportunities Sunday Bible Study ... Main Area

We continue to build off the Reformation and End Time themes of the Church Year: The Book of Daniel. Daniel provides a historical account of events from the Babylonian captivity, a period of about 70 years during which a portion of the Jewish nation lived against their will in a pagan culture. The first part of the Book shows how a faithful Jew, Daniel, was a great example to God's people both then and now. He remained faithful to the God of his fathers even while serving in the royal court of heathen kings.

The second part of Daniel is about the miraculous revelations God gave to Daniel. These were a preview of the world's future and how the future would affect God's chosen people. Though the Book of Daniel is in the Old Testament, it has been compared to the last book of the New Testament, the Revelation of St. John. It is our goal that this Bible Study will help us learn wonderful things about God's hand of control in history and His preservation of His people and the Gospel during difficult times.

### Church & School Call News ...

Just a reminder about what is meant by the term 'Call.' A Call recognizes the role God has in providing people to serve the church in what is called the 'public ministry' --- that is one acting on behalf of another, in this case, the church. The Call emphasizes the partnership between the Pastor/Teacher/Staff Minister (Called Workers) and the congregation. The Call is different from a 'hire' process for the Ministry Position looking to be filled. Called Workers do not seek out places to serve; rather the 'Call' comes to them from a Body of Believers (church-school). The Called Worker does not go through interviews for the Position looking to be filled. The congregation trusts the Lord will provide the Called Worker they need for that time in their existence as a congregation; and so, at a Call Meeting when a List of potential names (people) are given to the congregation to call, with prayer and after some discussion, the congregation extends a Call to one of those names on the List. Jodi Rowe, our Grade 3-4 Teacher, was extended a Call from Risen Savior in Pooler, GA; after prayerful consideration and conversations with people from St. Mark's and from Risen Savior, she has decided to accept the Call to Pooler, GA. Jodi will remain our Teacher through the 2024-25 School Year. We are thankful for her service to our church and school which began in the summer of 2022; we are also thankful for Cameron's involvement at our church and school, helping with events and doing plenty of behind-the-scenes efforts. The Board of Child Discipleship will be bringing recommendations before the congregation on how we may want to proceed. Pastor Kolander has received a Call to serve at Victory Lutheran Church in Jacksonville, FL. Over the next couple of weeks, PK will be speaking with members from here and from there to determine what the ministry needs are and where then best to continue serving the Lord and His people. Thank you for your prayers.

Making Connections --- Opportunities Prime Timers on the move ... Last Sunday's Lunch and Entertainment was a great restart to what had always been an active group until you know what happened a few years ago.
