#### CONGREGATION UPDATE !!!

**Pastor Vacancy.** We got great news last week. Pastor Brad Wright and his wife Susan will be coming to help us during our vacancy. His first Sunday with us will be March 16. We will organize a small welcome and introduction for them, details to follow.

Pastor Heckendorf, our AZ/CA District president, as promised, has worked with us to make sure we have good coverage until then. On Feb 16, Pastor Dan Waterstradt served us from Light of the Valleys in Reno. We will have coverage from guest pastors through February. On March 9, we are planning to have a lay-led (member officiated) worship service, similar to what was done the first two weeks of February. As a continued reminder, we are encouraged, during this time of vacancy, to embrace the fact that while some aspects of worship may be a little different according to each pastor, we can rest secure in the rock solid message of Law and Gospel which will remain the same.
