The Good Friday service of Tenebrae (meaning darkness) dates back to the 8th century A.D. It is characterized by the successive extinguishing of candles as the service progresses. The darkness is meant to impress on us the natural condition of our sinful hearts, the terrible reality of the separation from God we deserve because of our rebellion against Him, and the unnatural darkness which fell on the land from noon until the hour of three o'clock on the day Jesus died.

Near the end of the service the Christ Candle will be removed signifying Jesus' death and burial. The abrupt Closing of the Door symbolizes the sealing of the tomb. The Christ Candle will return to its place in anticipation of the Lord's resurrection from the grave on the third day, and of our own resurrections when Jesus returns again.
